



## Move On When Ready

### *Attention Junior and Senior Students*

#### **What is Move On When Ready (MOWR)?**

- MOWR is a new dual enrollment opportunity for students to attend a postsecondary institution full-time during their junior and/or senior year of high school.
- Students will receive high school credit and college credit simultaneously while attending college classes on the college campus, full-time. Approved college on-line courses can also be taken that meet high school graduation requirements.
- MOWR provides high school students the opportunity to “jump start” postsecondary education during the high school years.
- High school students will be free to “move on” earlier to the next educational level.
- Students will have an educational alternative other than the traditional high school setting or school day structure.
- Students can save money on future college costs since most expenses are paid as a part of local school system funding.

#### **How to participate in MOWR:**

- Meet with the high school counselor to discuss the guidelines and responsibilities of the program
- Complete an application form
- Select approved courses taken at the college level that meet the high school graduation requirements
- Meet the admission requirements of the selected college/university
- Have attended a Georgia public high school *full-time* the prior year (full year)

#### **What Else Do You Need To Know?**

- 1) Tuition is paid through local school system funds – materials, supplies, books, food, and transportation are the responsibility of the student
- 2) Students may live on campus or commute and the student is responsible for expenses related to these costs
- 3) Georgia public high school End of Course Tests and Georgia High School Graduation Test requirements must be met
- 4) Classes do not count against the HOPE Scholarship or Grant hours

## Georgia's Dual Enrollment

### *What is it?*

Dual Enrollment provides opportunities for Georgia high school students to take college-level courses and earn concurrent credit toward a **high school diploma and a college degree** while still in high school.

### Dual Enrollment Programs

#### Accel

... is a non-need based grant program offered for students that wish to take college-level (academic-only, degree-level) coursework for credit toward both high school and college graduation requirements.

#### Move On When Ready

...provides an **eligible** 11<sup>th</sup> or 12th grade student to take **ALL** of his or her courses through an eligible institution and/or a virtual program. Students receive secondary credit for completing graduation and high school diploma requirements.
