

 Lanier Technical College tuition is \$3,000 per year for a fulltime in-state resident. This is 17% cheaper than the national average public two year tuition of \$3,631. The cost is 34% cheaper than the average Georgia tuition of \$4,538 for 2 year colleges.

On-Campus

Online



Online courses are taught using Blackboard with most of the course content, activities and interactions occurring online. LTC requires at least one proctored activity in each course such as the midterm or final exam.


