Please be sure you and your student look these over, and <u>please sign off</u> that you understand our expectations. The most important thing for our students and families to truly understand: every student can make it through high school with zero discipline referrals while meeting minimal mastery and beyond with every course the first time. If a student's decision detracts from our school environment or another student's ability to learn, that student will be sent home with a plan in place to contribute in a more positive way the next time they are present at Apalachee High School.

Arrival, 8:15, Tardies

We have given everyone four days this week to get used to traffic patterns, prepare to arrive at school by 8:00, grab breakfast, and know how long it takes to walk to 1st period. The first bell of the day is at 8:15, and students arriving to class after 8:15 beginning Monday, August 7 will be considered an unexcused tardy. *Students need to be in their classrooms and ready to engage in learning at 8:15.* Students arriving on late busses will be given passes to class.

Also, all students should now understand how to avoid traffic in the hallways and get to their scheduled classes on time. Tardies for all classes will start accruing on Monday, August 7.

Student Checkouts

Student drivers may only check out with a handwritten note submitted to the Attendance Office in the morning before first period, and they may not leave until the note is verified and they checkout in the Attendance Office. Parents/guardians arriving to check students out will also be verified, and *there are no checkouts between 2:30-3:15* when the final bell rings. There are many tasks occurring in the offices at that time, and it creates traffic issues. All student check ins/outs will be through the Attendance Office.

Dress Code

The Apalachee High School dress code is consistent with the Barrow County School System dress code. We will offer any student breaking dress code an opportunity to adjust; however, if the student chooses not to adjust, that student will be sent home and expected to be picked up from our Attendance Office. Repeated dress code violations may result in other consequences as it distracts from learning and prevents staff from solving other issues. *One issue we've noticed this week is exposed midriffs; please correct this violation.* Please review all the dress code expectations carefully:

Student Parking

This is a privilege. If your student is driving faster than 15MPH on campus at any time, driving recklessly in the parking lot, or perhaps not paying attention to the administration and/or other teachers monitoring the parking lot, that privilege will be revoked. If a student driver is regularly tardy without alerting the school, the parking privilege will be revoked. If a student driver is showing irregular attendance patterns, the parking privilege will be revoked. If a student driver is gathering with friends before or after school, making it difficult for us to transition to the school day or to our after school events, the parking privilege will be revoked. We will make sure **your student** is aware of their first warning and then revoke the privilege should further inappropriate behavior continue. **There are no refunds for student parking when the privilege is revoked.** As an upperclassman, student drivers are responsible for their behavior in the parking lot.

There is no parent drop off or pick up in the student parking lot. This is a safety concern.

Other Important Procedures

- Students need to remain seated during lunch, not walking around or standing in the hallway.
- Students need to leave the building immediately after the final bell at 3:15 unless they are under the supervision of a teacher for tutoring, a sponsor for a club meeting, or a coach for practice or a game. Our offices close at 3:45 each day.

We are looking forward to a great year, and please remember that most of our procedures are in an effort to keep your student and others safe and focused on learning throughout the day.
