What is Title I?

What is it?

The school family engagement plan for shared student achievement describes how our school will provide opportunities to improve family engagement and support student learning. How is it revised?

Who is it for?

Our school will provide full opportunities for the participation of families with limited English, families with disabilities, and families of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is given to all students. The plan will also be posted on the school website. Families can also retrieve a copy of this plan in the Family Resource Center.

Reservation of Funds

Beginning with the 2014-2015 school year, our school agreed to allow the district to use the 1% set aside for family engagement to fund a district-wide Family Engagement Specialist (Ramón Manzo).

The district will provide clear guidance and communication to assist our school in developing adequate family engagement plans, activities and events that address the recommendations made by families during the comprehensive needs assessment survey as well as other input provided throughout the school year.

How we are promoting and supporting Family Engagement?

Our school will take the following measures to promote and support families as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our schools goals. We will:

- Ensure that all information related to school and family programs, meetings, and other activities is published in both English and Spanish, posted on the school website, and included in the monthly school newsletter for all families.
- Provide trainings four times per year for staff during their planning/professional development periods on strategies to improve communication with families and ideas to increase family engagement. Staff will also share best practices during regularly scheduled faculty meetings.
- Partner with early childhood programs, middle and high schools, college and career ready resources or organizations, parent resource centers, and other programs (as applicable) to help prepare families and their children for successful school transitioning.
- Communicate with all families and the community on a regular basis regarding school wide events and activities, through phone messages, Remind texts, social media, and flyers.
- Share information in English and Spanish on the school website and during school events for families to understand the school's academic standards and assessments. In addition, we will share ways families can monitor their child's progress and work with educators.
- Work with our families to develop relevant trainings and helpful presentations to educate our staff on the importance of family engagement.
- Collect feedback from families at all events and post a feedback form on the school website in order to respond to families' requests for additional support for family engagement activities/events. Provide alternate meetings times or digital copies of meeting materials upon request.

Goals for Student Achievement

- 1.Implement a K-12 vertically and horizontally aligned curriculum that prepares students for academic and career success.

School Goals

Goal 1:

- Seventy percent of third, fourth and fifth graders will score proficient or distinguished on the Georgia Milestones Assessment.
- Seventy percent of students will meet or exceed their projected growth in math MAP as measured from fall of 2023 to spring of 2024.

Goal 2:

• Seventy-five percent of third through fifth grade students in the spring will indicate from the "always" and "often" categories of the Georgia Student Health Survey that Yargo students treat each other well.

Goal 3:

- Seventy percent of all kindergarten through second grade will achieve at benchmark or above on end of year Dibels assessment for decoding and letter sounds.
- Seventy percent of third, fourth and fifth graders will meet or exceed their expected growth in reading on Spring MAP assessments.
- Seventy percent of all students in 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade will show mastery on the Cumulative Word Fluency Assessments within the Benchmark Phonics program.

Goal 4:

- Seventy percent of all third and fourth graders will achieve level 2, 3, or 4 on the spring 2024 narrative writing prompt for the Georgia Milestones assessment.
- Eighty percent of all fifth graders will achieve level 2, 3, or 4 on the spring 2024 narrative writing prompt for the Georgia Milestones assessment.
- Seventy percent of all second graders will score level 2, 3, or 4 on the spring writing assessment as administered and scored through Dr. Kevin Raczinski writing assessment support company.
- Seventy five percent of kindergarten and first grade will score at benchmark (green or blue) on the spring assessment while using the Yargo writing checklist.
